

# Norton Children's Hospital Foundation Annual Report

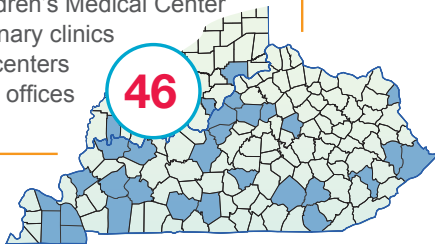

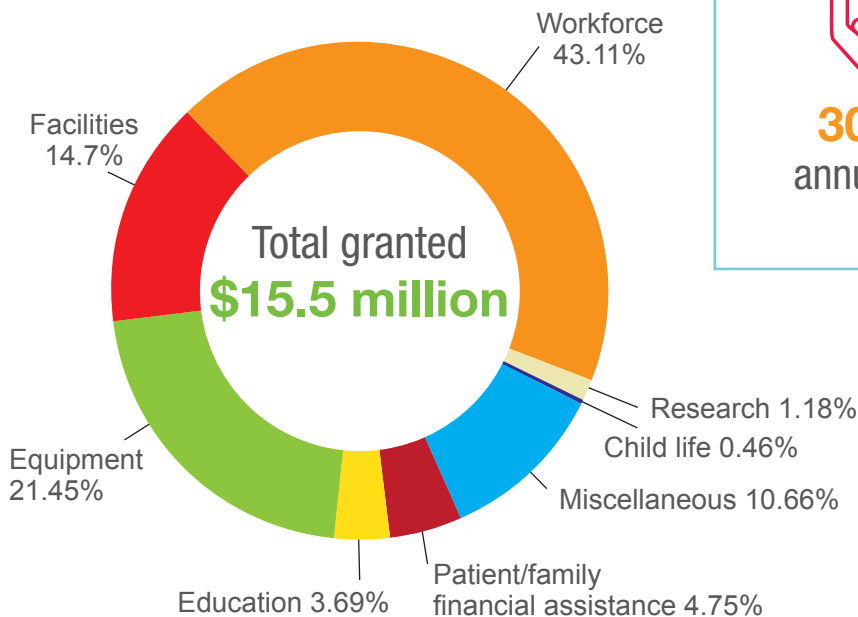
